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Volume I of Vincenti Digital's CD-ROM project contains 12 complete English Madrigal collections clearly laid out in score for you to browse and print at your leisure. This amounts to nearly 300 pieces. The title is English Madrigals, Volume I

Parts

All pieces are also supplied with sets of parts (clefs for both strings and recorders). Many collections were originally described as "Apt for Voices or Viols" and were almost certainly designed for a mixture of voices and instruments.

Transpositions

Many pieces are supplied both at the original pitch, and at an alternative (normally lower) pitch. Some collections contain 3-part madrigals or canzonets printed at a SST pitch (original clefs g2g2f3) which for most of us will sound better down a fourth or so.

Format

All pieces supplied as PDF files for A4

Restrictions

None. You can print out as many copies as you like, but you cannot sell them to a third party.
